Financial Review-Actions to be Taken

- 1. Creation of Post Finance Guidelines
- 2. Purchase of a new Post checkbook
- Conducting of an annual review of Financial Condition of Post
- 4. Require two signatures for any expense over \$500
- 5. Mandatory policy for check request forms for all expenses
- 6. All bills/invoices are forwarded to Finance officer
- 7. Establish policies for use of cash boxes
- 8. Begin 2019/2020 financial year with balance of \$9,532.65




