WHAT IS READJUSTMENT COUNSELING

Readjustment counseling includes Individual, Group, Family/Marital (must be specific to military or deployment related issues) counseling offered to eligible Veterans, active duty service members, and their families in the effort to make a successful transition from military to civilian life

WHO IS ELIGIBLE FOR THESE SERVICES

If you:

- Served in a combat zone (You do NOT have to have engaged in direct combat, you do NOT have to be service connected for PTSD)
- Experienced Military Sexual Trauma (MST) regardless of combat status
- Dealt directly with the treatment of the casualties of war but is not located in a combat theater area of hostilities
- Were a member of a drone (unmanned aerial vehicle) crew who participated in combat related missions from outside the combat theater or area of hostility

There is NO COST for Readjustment Counseling Services.

Services are confidential (except when someone's safety may be compromised or issues involving potential or alleged child neglect/abuse), and the Vet Center does not share their information with the VA Hospitals or DOD.
