<u>Guest Speakers</u>: This evening we had 1 presentation and 2 guest speakers:

- 1. **Bill Nadeau,** Town of Leland Parks and Facilities Manager brought multiple display boards showing architectural drawings of proposed future park amenities. Post members were encouraged to vote for which design they most favored. Mr. Nadeau was on-hand to answer questions. Bill left @ 6pm just prior to our meeting start.
- 2. **Bailey Smith** was our Oratorical Contest winner who gave her winning speech on the Constitution to members present. She will be competing in the Division 9 Oratorical contest being held at St James Post 545 this coming Saturday. Baily was well received by the membership and did a great job.
- 3. **Carlo Montagano**, Executive Director for Brunswick County Habitat for Humanity gave a presentation on the services that Habitat provides here in Brunswick County. Slides were provided. He also talked about a new program they have that emphasizes support to veterans called the Veterans Build Program, Veterans can be eligible for housing and/or home repairs & wheelchair ramps. Veterans will receive more relaxed requirements for receiving aid. Carlo is encouraging engagement between Habitat and other non-profit organizations. Carlo provided our Service Officer will various forms and material veterans can use to apply for services. Habitat is working on an intake program whereby Legion Posts can help veterans apply for support. First Vice Jim Zelenski suggested that the Post take advantage of this offer and work with Habitat.

3. By-Laws update: Commander – We have our new Charter document with a page for Post members to sign which was on a back table where members present were able to add their names.



- 5. Concerns and Sick Call: Brian Danielson, Chaplain Nothing to report. Made offer to visit members if needed
- 6. Service Officer: Lane Adrian (1) The PEC (Post Executive Committee) had approved funding to support the daughter of a local veteran who needed respite support. Was also able to get the veteran into the VA health system. (2) We helped a local veteran with his rent who was in danger of eviction. PEC approved a check to assist. Veteran is also unemployed. We are following up to see how else we can help. (3) Lane has forms and info for getting veterans into the VA health care system for anyone who needs them. This is our benefit which we earned!
- 7. Service Awards: Adjutant Dan Dodge We started these in September and still have several to issue out to members. Tonight, Art Dietrich received his. 4 others were given to members who know the recipients and will take to them. The remaining 14 awards will be mailed out. Service awards will be presented again this coming September for anyone with an anniversary event (5, 10, 15 etc years).
- 8. BELK Charity Sale (November): Dale Todd This last sale, which occurred November 9th at a time when we had many other events going on still brought in over \$600 to the Post.

NEW BUSINESS:

- 1. **2020 Events:** Commander gave a quick overview of our 2020 events calendar emphasizing to members that we need help and support to run these events, many of which require a member to lead them. If no member steps forward, the event will not happen. We are planning to do our Fish Fry fundraiser this spring. In order to do so, we need a lead by the end of January. If no lead, there will be no event. The Fish Fry brought in over \$1000 this past year so it is an important fund raiser. A note to members will be going out soon.
