Looking back on the past year, 2019-2020 was a successful year for Post 68. We continued the trend of the past 5 years of exceeding department goals for membership growth. We completed a significant revision to our Post Constitution & By-laws (C&B), obtained approval from the Department and implemented changes included in the revised C&B, including renaming the Post.
