Currently, the state of North Carolina remains under a mandatory order restricting the gathering of individuals to help prevent the spread of Covid-19. Governor Cooper signed Executive order #155 on 5 August extending his Executive order #141 until September 11th. Our Department of NC Commander, James Moore has also ordered that Posts are to abide by the Governor's order and refrain from holding in-person meetings. Therefore, we have cancelled our August Membership meeting and will wait for further guidance regarding our September meeting. Gerald Sadowsky, a New York City native, took part in the 82nd Airborne Division's June 6, 1944 D-Day drop into Nazi occupied France. In 2012, Sadowsky was awarded the French Legion of Honour, Chevalier (Knight) Class, officially National Order of the Legion of Honour, French Ordre National de la Légion d'honneur for his D-Day and World War II service and sacrifice.
