OLD BUSINESS:

June:

1. Post Elections: Dan Dodge – Dodge explained how Post elections process works. During our April PEC meeting, the PEC board voted to approve our slate of officers. This evening, Dodge explained that as of our April meeting, we close and freeze the ballot after asking if there are any additional nominations. Protocol was followed whereby Dodge asked the membership 3 times if there were any additional nominations, there being none, Dodge then asked for a motion to be made to close and freeze the ballot for elected positions. Motion was made and seconded. Members were asked to approve the motion which was passed by unanimous show of hands. Ballet of elected positions is now frozen. - 2. JROTC status: Dale Todd. Todd reviewed current status of JROTC Rifle Team support for carpentry work. Then covered Boys State and Girls State status, both of which are being held. Post 68 is sponsoring students to each with Todd managing the selection and interviewing process. Finally, we have winners for our annual Post 68 Jacobs Scholarship along with JROTC Military and Scholastic excellent awards. Waiting for word from NBHS as to how these awards are to be presented to the recipients.
- 3. Plaque presentation for Blossoms: John Hacker. Because of their continuous support of Post 68, we presented a plaque to Kelly Lackey, manager at Blossoms, thanking them for their support.

- 4. **Fish Fry event update**: Dan Fortini. Fortini gave a summary update of the results of our Fish Fry event.
 - We sold out of fish with 333 tickets sold, 250 meals served
 - Net income was \$2803. Very successful.

In addition, we have been sending copies of our event writeups with photos to the Department Adjutant who is now publishing them in the Department Spot Light bulletin.
