<u>Guest Speaker:</u> Michael Kirchner, Children of Peace International (Vietnam) (Intro by Dan Dodge)

Mr. Kirchner talked to the membership regarding his Air Force service during Vietnam which led to him working with Children of Peach International. CIP works with children of Vietnam to help provide schools, education, tuition & health benefits. CIP was formed in 1993 by Tam Binh to support Tam's orphanage in Ho Chi Minh City. The organization has since expanded to include work in multiple cities across Vietnam. The groups mission is not to assume responsibility as a total provider of services to these children but to be a friend and supporter and to help provide the means for the people to build a healthy community with a promising future.

Commander Todd will be putting together a team to tackle this procedure.
